God Is the Creator

Genesis 1:1-2:25

In the beginning, God created everything in six days. All we see came from God's imagination and through His power! On the final day of creation, God made Adam and Eve in His image. They had a perfect relationship with God—they trusted Him, walked with Him, worked alongside Him, and talked with Him. God made a covenant with them. A covenant is God's special, unbreakable promise to His people. Everything was just as God created it to be.

Talk about these questions at home:

- What was the last thing God created? Why was it special?
- What does it mean for people to be made in God's image?

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God Loves Us

Genesis 2:16-17; 3:1-24

God made a covenant with Adam and Eve in the garden. A covenant is God's special, unbreakable promise to His people. Adam and Eve only had one rule—don't eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. As long as they obeyed that one command, God provided everything they needed. But Adam and Eve didn't obey God, and they broke the covenant God made with them—committing the first sin. Even though they sinned, God's love for humanity continued.

Talk about these questions at home:

- Why do you think Adam and Eve ate the fruit when God told them not to?
- How do we see God's love in this story after Adam and Eve sinned?

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God Keeps His Promises

Genesis 6:9-9:17

While the world was corrupt and filled with sin, Noah was a godly man. God brought judgment through a flood, but He saved Noah and his family, along with animals. After the flood, God made a covenant with Noah—promising never to destroy the earth with water again—and sealed it with a rainbow. A covenant is God's special, unbreakable promise to His people. God still keeps this promise today. The rainbow reminds us that God's promises are stronger than our sins.

Talk about these questions at home:

- How was Noah different from everyone else in the world?
- What covenant did God make with Noah?

JUNE 18 & 21



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God Is Faithful

Genesis 12-15 (12:1-5; 15:1-6)

God made a covenant with Abram, promising him land, making him a great nation, and blessing all people through him. A covenant is God's special, unbreakable promise to His people. Abram faced many barriers, including famine, fear, and not having children. But through it all, God was faithful. Abram decided to trust that what God said was true, even when he couldn't see the whole picture. Abram's story reminds us that even when obstacles seem impossible to overcome, God keeps His promises.

Talk about these questions at home:

- What is a covenant?
- Why is it sometimes hard to wait on God's promises?
