God's Plan Is Good

Exodus 1-2:10; 3:1-15

God kept His promise to Abraham and made his family into a great nation—the Israelites kept growing in number! Pharaoh was afraid they would overturn his power, so he made them his slaves and then ordered them to throw all the baby boys in the Nile River. Pharaoh's daughter found one of these babies, raised Him, and named him Moses. At the burning bush, God told Moses he would lead the Israelites out of slavery. God had a plan all along!

Talk about these questions at home:

- Who was Moses and what was God's plan for him?
- How did Moses respond when God called him from the burning bush?

JULY 30 & AUGUST 2



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God Is All Powerful

Exodus 5:1-2; 7:8-12:39

The Israelites were slaves in Egypt, but God had a plan to use Moses to rescue them. Moses asked Pharaoh to let the Israelites go again and again, but each time he refused. Each refusal was followed by a plague—there were ten in total. Pharaoh thought his gods were more powerful than the God. The last plague, the death of the firstborn, was so devastating that Pharaoh let them go. Through the plagues, God showed that He is all powerful.

Talk about these questions at home:

- Can you name some of the plagues God sent on Egypt?
- What do the plagues teach you about God's power?

AUGUST 6 & 9



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God Is the One and Only God

Exodus 19-20

After Moses led the Israelites out of slavery, they arrived at Mount Sinai, where God established a covenant with them. A covenant is God's special, unbreakable promise to His people. On the mountain, God gave Moses the Ten Commandments—instructions that showed the Israelites how to obey God, love Him, and love others as God's covenant people. They agreed to do everything the Lord had said.

Talk about these questions at home:

- What are some things we might love more than God?
- Which commandment is easiest for you to follow?
Which is the hardest?

AUGUST 13 & 16



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God is Patient

Numbers 13-14

The time came to check out the Promised Land, so Moses sent twelve scouts to explore it. Ten of the men reported back afraid of the giant people and the great city walls. But Joshua and Caleb disagreed—they thought the land was good, and they trusted God. The people forgot God's faithfulness and would not enter the Promised Land. God is patient, and He was willing to wait for people who would trust and obey Him.

Talk about these questions at home:

- What made Joshua and Caleb different from the other spies?
- How do you think God responds when we mess up?
