God Is Trustworthy

Joshua 1:1-11; 5:13-20

After 40 years in the wilderness, Joshua led the Israelites into the Promised Land God had promised to Abraham. Camped outside Jericho and preparing to take the city, they received unexpected instructions from God. Rather than attacking, they were to march around the city once a day for six days and seven times on the seventh day. The Israelites believed that God is trustworthy and they obeyed—and the walls of Jericho fell.

Talk about these questions at home:

- The walls fell just like God said they would. What does that tell us about God?
- What helps you trust God when you're worried or afraid?

God Leads Us

Judges 2:6-20; 4:1-5:3

Throughout Judges, the Israelites lived in a cycle. They forgot God, trouble came, they turned back to Him, He sent a judge to rescue them, and they followed Him again. Oppressed by King Jabin and his commander Sisera, the Israelites cried out to God, and He sent them a judge named Deborah. Though underdogs, God led Deborah and her leader Barak to defeat them. The Israelites worshiped God and the cycle was complete. Until it started again...

Talk about these questions at home:

- How did God use Deborah to help the Israelites?
- Have you ever felt God leading you to make a certain choice? What was it?

God Knows Our Hearts

1 Samuel 16:1-13; 8:1-10:1

The book of 1 Samuel marks Israel's transition from judges to kings. The Israelites told Samuel they wanted a king to be like surrounding nations, and God gave them what they wanted. Saul looked the part—tall, handsome, impressive—but he did not obey and represent God. While Saul still reigned, God anointed an unlikely successor: the young shepherd David. Unlike Saul, David was chosen not for his appearance or status, but because God knew his heart.

Talk about these questions at home:

- Why is our heart important to God?
- What do you think God sees when He looks at our hearts?

God Is Faithful

2 Samuel 5-7

When David became king, he made Jerusalem the capital and brought the Ark of the Covenant there, establishing it as Israel's spiritual center. The Ark symbolized God's holy presence among His people. David wanted to build a temple for God, but instead God made a covenant with David—promising to build an eternal royal dynasty through him. This promise, continuing God's covenant promises with Abraham, finds its fulfillment in Jesus, the perfect eternal King. David responded with worship and gratitude, because God is faithful.

Talk about these questions at home:

- What covenant did God make with David?
- When have you seen God's faithfulness in your life?
